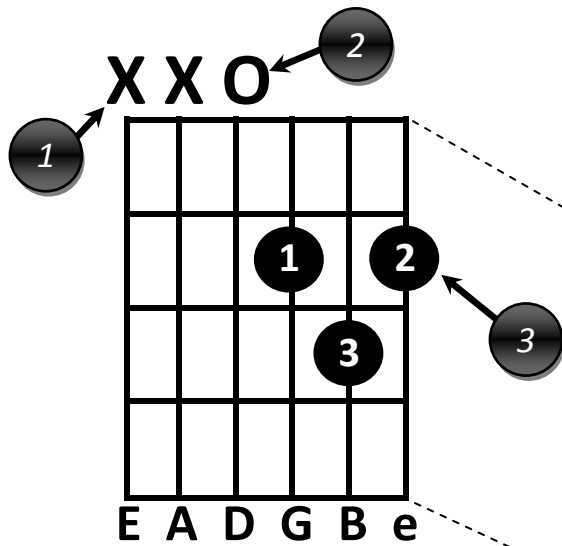


Chord Boxes

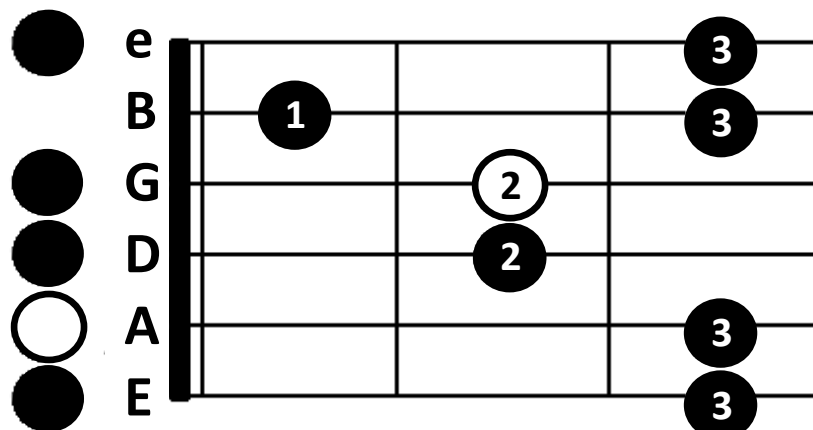
Chord Boxes are a graphical representation of the guitar neck used to demonstrate chords as shown below.



- 1 Do not play string
- 2 Play open string
- 3 Where to place fingers

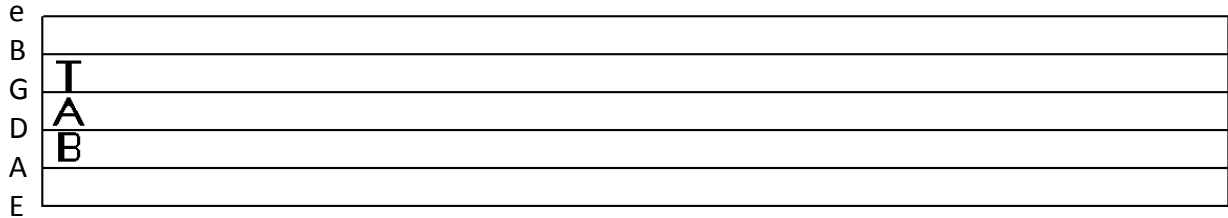
Scale Boxes

Scale Boxes are used to notate scales, unlike chord boxes the dots are to be played one at a time, starting at the bottom and moving from left to right.

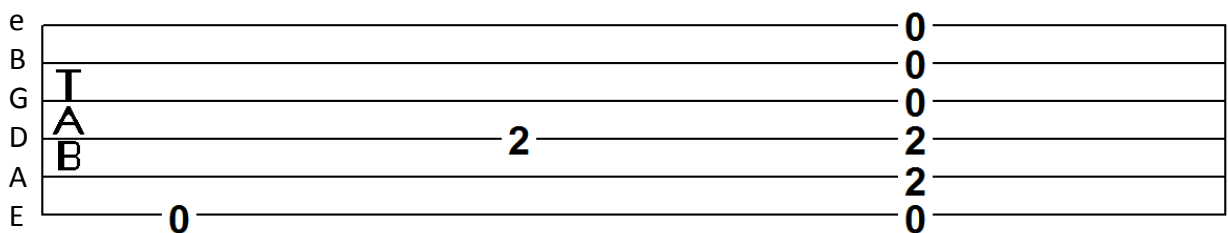


Tablature

Tablature (or Tab for short) is one of the most common systems of notating guitar music and consists of six lines, each representing a string on the guitar.



Numbers are used to indicate which fret to play. A '0' represents an open string, whilst a '2' would indicate to hold down fret '2'. When numbers are stacked on top of one another this means play them all together.



Standard Notation

Standard Notation is the traditional system used to notate music, unlike Tablature Standard Notation is used by all instruments not just Guitar. Often Tablature and Standard Notation are grouped together as shown below.
